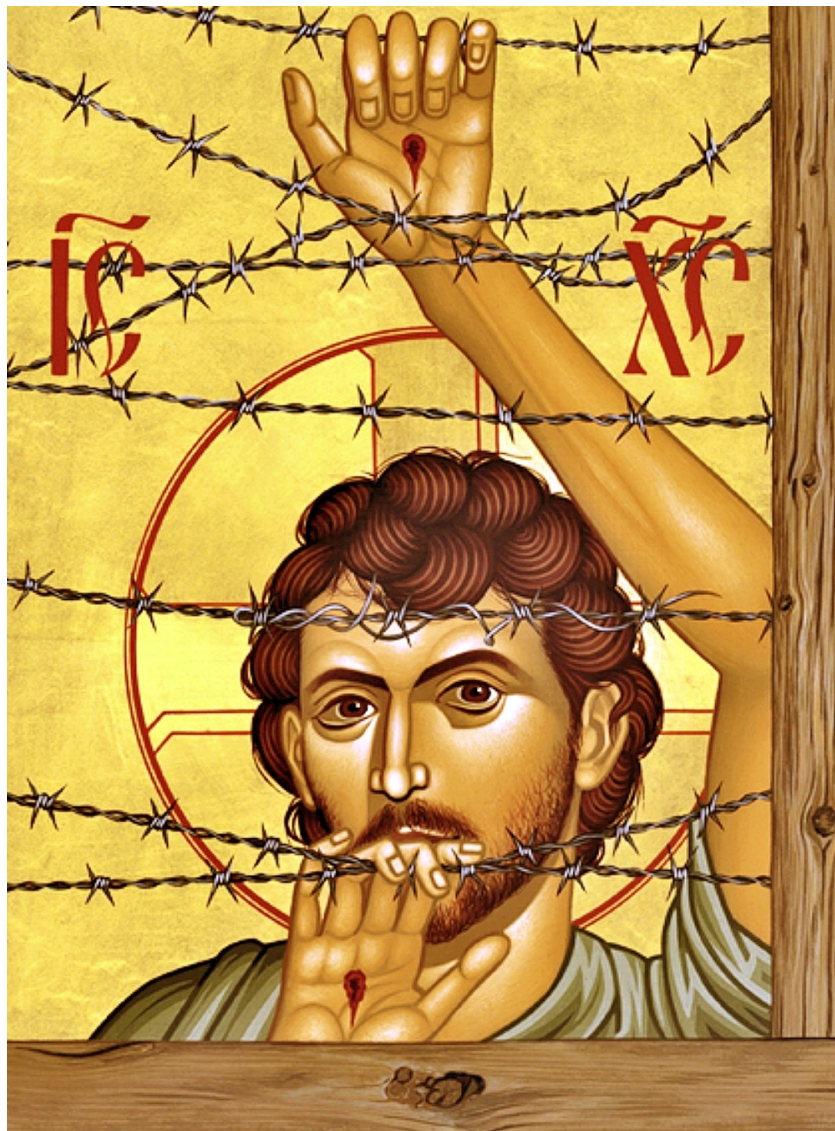

JESUS, CALLING US OUT OF THE CHAOS, INTO GOD’S SHALOM.

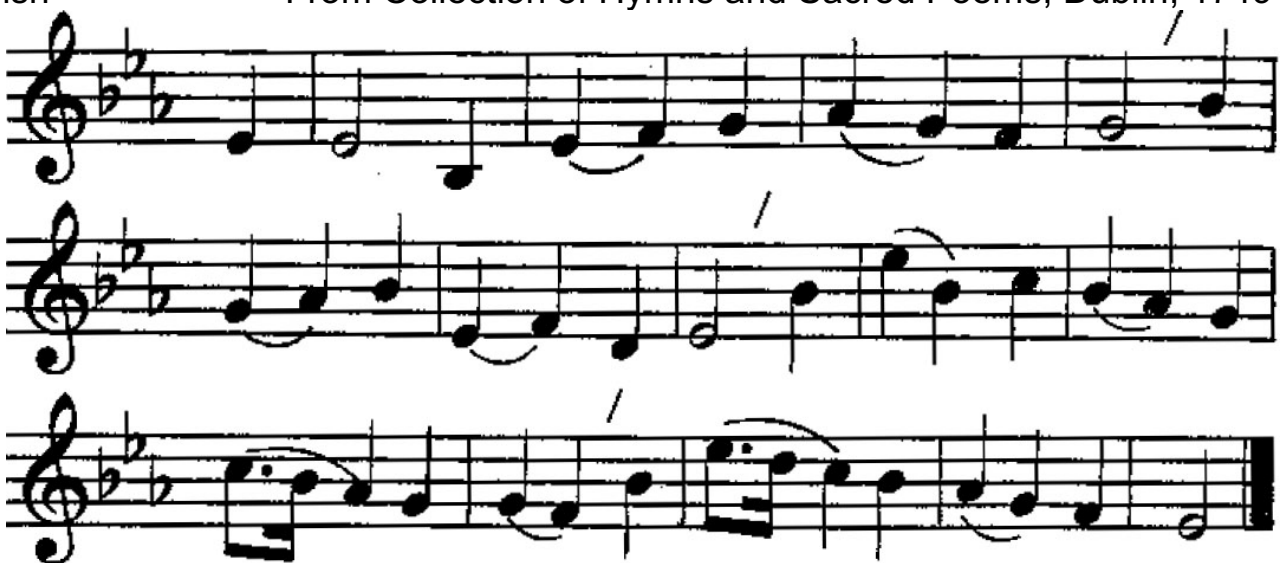

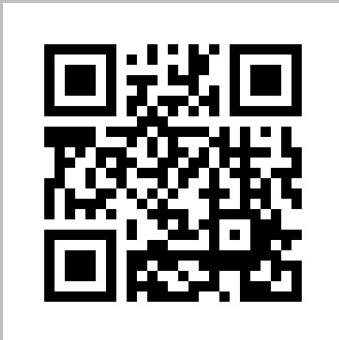
