AFTER THE SHOOTING

On Friday 15 March 2019, Christchurch became the home to Aotearoa New Zealand's largest ever mass murder and first ever declared "terrorist attack". Shootings occurred at two mosques: one 2.3 kilometres west of Knox, and another 4.3 kilometres east. At the time of the printing of this replacement order of service, 49 Christchurch people were recorded as having been killed. 20 more are recorded as being critically ill in our public hospital.

We break our regular service schedule to attend to this.

WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. A loop system for hearing aids operates at Knox.

Toilets are available through the door on the lectern side of the sanctuary.
