Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. The Military and Hospitaller Order of St Lazarus of Jerusalem

The Order of St Lazarus was named after a character in one of Jesus' parables - Lazarus, the poor man with leprosy, who beat the rich and powerful Dives into heaven. He was chosen (in medieval times) as the figure head for the order, since it had a special concern to care for people with leprosy. These days, members of the order sponsor all manner of charitable causes, but still have a focussed concern for people with skin conditions and diseases. The local branch of the order appreciate the opportunity to visit congregations of diverse denominations around the region and gently spread the word about its work. Knox Council has agreed to welcome local branch to the service on 18 August.
