

WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. We strive to be open to dialogue and shared experiences with people of other faiths. We take care to use inclusive language in our services. References to God in traditional prayers and hymns may sometimes be gender-specific. As we pray and sing together, you're invited to adapt the words we've chosen. When we pray the "Lord's prayer", feel free to pray in your first language.

We have brought with us some money and food, and now we pray.


MAY THIS BE THE KIND OF PRAYER


FREE* BUS TRIP TO PEGASUS - If you would like to go and see how Pegasus Town, in the Waimakariri district is developing and stop there for a coffee at the local café, maybe even go for a walk around the lake if the weather is nice, then join us for a trip on the number 95 bus on Saturday the 2nd of November. Although buses go hourly, it would of course be nice to travel together: we are looking at catching the 95 bus that leaves from Victoria St, across the road from Knox, at 9.52 (be at the bus stop at 9.45), to arrive at our destination at 10.46. Leave your car in the Knox car park. The Flat White café is not too far from the bus stop and a walk around the lake takes about an hour. To return home, the bus leaves from Pegasus at 12.05, 13.05 and so on.
