A COMMUNION SERVICE

In December of 2019, the mysterious street artist, Banksy, produced the work above, calling it "Scar of Bethlehem". Putting the holy family beneath a star shaped like a cross around a bullet hole, the artist brings together themes of birth and death, peace and war, blessing and cursing. Why would he do that? Is he the first do it? Our service takes its theme today from the last words of an elderly person called Simeon.

WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We take care to use inclusive language in our services. References to God in traditional prayers and hymns may sometimes be gender-specific. As we pray and sing together, you're invited to adapt the words we've chosen. When we pray the "Lord's prayer", feel free to pray in your first language.

Shirley Murray, who died last week, was one of Aotearoa New Zealand's most prolific and respected hymn writers. While her husband, John, was minister here at Knox from 1967-1975, Shirley was well known to many Knox people. 
The Call to Worship:


