Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. 
Bus trip to Kaiapoi 14 March - A bus trip (public transport) has been planned for the 14th of March, this time to Kaiapoi. We are aiming at catching the number 95 bus together at 9:52 (hourly service) from the Victoria St. bus stop, across the road from Knox. Please be at the bus stop from 9:45, in case the bus is early. You can leave your car at the Knox car-park. Arrival in Kaiapoi (MC Donald's) at around 10:24. There are several coffee shops, a new pub/café on the river's edge and various retail shops to explore. There are a few nice walking tracks along the river for those who want to stretch their legs. You may even be able to catch a cruise on the Kaiapoi River Queen but note that you need to book this in advance. To return, there is a bus at 11:29, arrive Vic St 12:03; 12:29, arrive 1:03; 1:29, arrive 2:03 etc.
