### WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. We strive to be open to dialogue and shared experiences with people of other faiths. We enjoy worshipping the God made known in Jesus, endeavouring to do so in ways that are relevant to our daily lives, respect the integrity of creation, and make a positive difference to our wider world.

### **HEALTH MATTERS**

In a time of concern about the spread of the Corona virus, the national office of the PCANZ has asked congregations, as they gather for public worship, to observe some cautionary protocols. The minister will speak to these at the start of the service.

- During the passing of the peace, where usual practice is to shake hands, alternatives will be encouraged.
- Today we will not be passing the offering bags around, hand to hand.
  Offering boxes will be available on the tables by the Victoria Street
  doors and in the new foyer. If you haven't put your offering in the box
  before the service, simply deposit your offering there after the service being aware that the offering prayer is offered in the understanding that
  all offerings, regardless of current location, are dedicated.
- Consider washing your hands before and after morning tea. The
  morning tea servers will have done the same, and we will be washing all
  dishes for the foreseeable future in the dishwasher, rather than more
  gently by hand in the sink. They will also pour milk into your tea or
  coffee (if required) to minimize the number of hands on the milk jugs.
- If you need to cough, please cover your mouth, preferably coughing into your elbow.

And, of course, if you are feeling unwell, please ring your doctor and think carefully about whether you ought to be circulating in public places.

A loop system for hearing aids operates at Knox.

Toilets are available through the door on the lectern side of the sanctuary.

Please don't leave any items unattended around the church; they may cause alarm.

We take care to use inclusive language in our services. References to God in traditional prayers and hymns may sometimes be gender-specific. As we pray and sing together, you're invited to adapt the words we've chosen. When we pray the "Lord's prayer", feel free to pray in your first language.



# During an early response to Covid-19 virus, Kia Ora Knox Community!

At our meeting tonight, the Knox Church Council (the body governing our community) spent time discussing issues around the Covid-19 pandemic. We understand that this is a time of heightened anxiety - and not something we need.

Overseas, communities are dealing with bereavements and prohibitions on public gatherings. At home, while we've had no bereavements, and infections so far are assessed as being "contained to overseas transmission", people here seem to have given up gathering locally. Local businesses, consequently, particularly in the hospitality industry, are feeling extreme pressure. Some are "going under". Please support your local businesses. Don't let them fail for reasons totally beyond their control.

We see our role, amid this, as trying to keep our own community life as normal and connected as possible - keeping calm and carrying on. Committed to that, we've judged it sensible to make a few operational adjustments.

### **Our Simple Changes:**

- During our services, we no longer shake hands during the "sign of peace".
   We deploy other non-contact expressions of love and goodwill. The minister no longer shakes hands at the door as people leave.
- At morning tea, we have no more biscuits on open trays, and ask our servers to pour your milk for you, and to spoon in your sugar. We welcome you bringing your own cup or mug. We're cleaning all our crockery in the dishwasher, rather than by hand.
- For the moment, we're not serving communion. Before Easter, when communion next would be served, we'll assess the situation.

- Our welcoming teams on Sunday morning door duty are encouraging people to sit in the church pews at 2 metre distances from those with whom they do not live. This may require people moving a wee bit from established places of occupation! We have enough space in our building for this to work.
- We're placing paper towels in our toilet rooms, since hand dryers are seen, during current times, as sub-optimal.

### What we ask of you:

- 1. Please keep an eye on your physical state and feelings. If you begin to display symptoms of Covid-19, please stay at home. The symptoms are included in the notices section of all orders of service printed and posted from 22 March.
- 2. If you are feeling lonely or frightened, during any time of isolation of suspended community gatherings, ring the church office (379 2456) and talk to Jane. She will organize for someone living close to you to give you a call. It's important that we keep in touch but it may have to be by telephone.
- 3. Please look out for your neighbours. People beyond Knox are bound to have vulnerabilities and needs.

### Our church services:

Unless we are instructed to curtail public gathering, we intend to continue to gather for Sunday worship - with appropriate bio-security measures in place. If we are required to cease meeting, we're well prepared to broadcast our services online, via you-tube, and to post transcripts to those who have no internet connection.

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Christchurch people are really good at taking care of our neighbours during times of difficulty. We will rise to this one!

### Request for three interviews


Request sent to the minister of Knox from Emeritus Professor Amanda Barusch, of Otago University:
