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WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. Celebrating communion during Level Three

For a long time, now, we have celebrated communion on the first Sunday of each month at Knox. Communion has acted as a celebratory affirmation, of our being one body in Christ ("one bread, one body"). Communion, obviously, usually involves our gathering physically, which under Level Three containment requirements, we still cannot do. Nevertheless, because we may need a way of expressing the God-gifted unity from which nothing in all creation can separate us, I've decided to continue including communion in our liturgy for the first Sunday of the month while we are physically separated.

While it may be enough for you to see the bread broken at my house, it may be important for you to also have bread at your house. I leave it over to you to do what feels right for you at this time. The One whom we worship will, I believe, understand what we are trying to do.


