

WELCOME TO KNOX



Prayer of Approach

The king is glorious above, with clouds and stars **AND SUN AND MOON**,

yet also with kitchen tidies AND THE SMALLNESS OF THE DETAILS OF OUR "DAY BY DAY".

The king is glorious above, where perspective is broad, **AND ALL MAKES SENSE**.

Yet he reigns also in the dust and in the haircut, IN THE FORGOTTEN OBJECTS AND APPOINTMENTS, AND THINGS WE JUST DON'T GET.

Jesus Christ, as Lord of heaven and earth, you live this tremendous, stretching life for us, between what we see and cannot see, **BETWEEN WHAT WE KNOW AND DO NOT KNOW**,

We pray this in your name, using the words you gave us, together saying:

OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME, YOUR KINGDOM COME, YOUR WILL BE DONE, ON EARTH AS IN HEAVEN. GIVE US TODAY OUR DAILY BREAD.

FORGIVE US OUR SINS AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO SIN AGAINST US. SAVE US FROM THE TIME OF TRIAL AND DELIVER US FROM EVIL. FOR THE KINGDOM, THE POWER AND THE GLORY ARE YOURS NOW AND FOR EVER. AMEN.


Since the anthem is sung in Latin, an English translation is provided:
