WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. Sunday 25 July: 11.15 in the lounge Book Group: The Secret River by Kate Grenville. This prizewinning Australian novel (first published 2005) tells of William Thornhill, who was transported from London to Sydney in 1806. He earns his freedom and settles on 'empty' land, which belongs to the Darug people. This book is the first of three, inspired by the author's own family history. We will also look at the book she wrote about the search for the truth about the choices her ancestor made.

Sunday 8 August: 4pm in the lounge. Film: The Rabbit-Proof Fence. This moving and inspiring true story, set in 1931, follows three Aborigine girls who walk 1500 miles across the arid heartland of Australia, following the rabbit-proof fence, to return to their tribal homeland. The girls are part of the "Stolen Generation": children who were forcibly removed from their homes between 1905 and 1967.

Public Questions and Social Issues

In recent times, I've noticed two Parliamentary Select Committees calling for submissions on matters I think would be of interest at Knox: (1) conversion therapy, and (2) hate speech. It seems to me that both topics probably would have prompted submissions from religious groups whose opinions would not align with Knox's values but who would claim to be the sole Christian voice. The PCANZ Public Questions Committee has been disestablished, as has the Methodist Church's equivalent. The Alpine Presbytery's "Church and Society Committee" seems to have has ceased its work. Although it's now too late to make submissions on conversion therapy and hate speech, Knox Council wonders whether there is interest here in the formation of a group that could respond to public issues as they arise. If you're interested in participating in such a group, let me know, and we'll see what happens.


