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WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. Prayer of Approach

While he is humble and riding on a donkey, while he makes no great noise, the people see in him something that makes them sing.

BLESSED IS THE ONE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD!

At his arrival in their place, they grab whatever is at hand, cloaks and branches to express their joy with an abandoned "devil may care".

GLORY IN THE HIGHEST HEAVEN!

When Christ is present among the people, when it is realised that God is in the moment, when God's love rides on into human life, it is as if even the stones on the ground are singing. **EVEN THE STONES SHOUT OUT!**

With those who welcomed Jesus on that special day, and with those who over the centuries have proclaimed the joy and peace he brings, we too would add our praise.

ALL GLORY, PRAISE AND HONOUR TO YOU, REDEEMER, KING!

Silence

Within the crowd, however, are some Pharisees - calling for the praise to stop. For them, the presence of God in Christ is threatening and bad.

DO THEY FEAR THE JOY OF THE PEOPLE? DO THEY FEAR THE LOSS OF THEIR INFLUENCE?

We do not know but we know that when joy is silenced
and when truth is suppressed,
when the powerful begin to feel insecure,
bad things happen in the world.
So, recognising something of the Pharisee in ourselves,
for the world, and our hurting of it, we say

Lord have mercy.

CHRIST HAVE MERCY.

Lord have mercy.

Assurance and Response

You are forgiven and you are free. THANKS BE TO GOD.

Prayer of Supplication:

Not turning back, but committing himself to the final stretch of his Lenten road, Jesus, the blessed One, receives the praises of the people.

GIVE US THE SPIRIT OF WELCOME, O GOD, THAT WE, AND EVEN THE STONES ON OUR GROUND MAY FIND OUR VOICE OF PRAISE.

And as the week proceeds, and the voices of those around us lose their joy, framing their cries of "crucify", MAY WE NOT FAINT, BUT EVER SAY: "BLESSED IS THE ONE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD".

We pray this in the name of the Palm Sunday Jesus, using the words he taught us, together saying:

OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN
HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME,
YOUR KINGDOM COME,
YOUR WILL BE DONE,
ON EARTH AS IN HEAVEN.
GIVE US TODAY OUR DAILY BREAD.
FORGIVE US OUR SINS
AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO SIN AGAINST US.
SAVE US FROM THE TIME OF TRIAL
AND DELIVER US FROM EVIL.
FOR THE KINGDOM, THE POWER AND THE GLORY ARE YOURS
NOW AND FOR EVER. AMEN.

The Passing of the Peace


