WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. It is another to consider the striving of people like Paul, and Timothy, and the great train of other people of faith who had to build the body of Christ with blood, sweat, tears and human hope -BUILDING THE HEAVENLY CITY IN THE RAW HERE AND NOW.

From our human reality, the stuff of our life together, **WE PRAISE THE GOD WHO BUILDS THE CITY.**


