

WELCOME TO KNOX

Knox Church is a congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand. We aim to create Christian community in which people of all ages, sexual orientations, cultural backgrounds and socio-economic situations are included as equally valued participants in our congregational life. We cherish our diversity, offering a safe place of belonging to any who wish to explore their beliefs in an atmosphere promoting discussion, the development of healthy relationships and spiritual growth. We strive to be open to dialogue and shared experiences with people of other faiths. We enjoy worshipping the God made known in Jesus, endeavouring to do so in ways that are relevant to our daily lives, respect the integrity of creation, and make a positive difference to our wider world.

A loop system for hearing aids operates at Knox.

Toilets are available through the door on the lectern side of the sanctuary.

We take care to use inclusive language in our services. References to God in traditional prayers and hymns may sometimes be gender-specific. As we pray and sing together, you're invited to adapt the words we've chosen.

When we pray the Lord's Prayer, you are welcome to use the language that is most natural to you.

Prayer of Approach



The "Jesus laughing and loving" project was created by the Church of Scotland in 2004. By way of envelope, filing cabinet, and lost shuffled paper, the material came to Matthew, who's releasing the paintings and reflections one by one until the papers run out.

NUMBER TWELVE OF THIRTY FIVE

"Come, See and Believe", by Ni Ketut Ayu Sri Wardani, Den Pasar, Indonesia.

This painting describes the appearance of Jesus Christ after his resurrection to Thomas, known as one of the 12 chosen disciples of Jesus. The relationship of these disciples with Jesus was intimate and it is possible that they were together almost all the time. But Thomas doubted and found Jesus' resurrection difficult to accept. But in a display of God's grace, Jesus stood one day right in front of Thomas

and said "Come, place your finger on my wounded palm, and you will see". Oh, how shocked Thomas must have been In shame amazement, his blush could surely be seen. No doubt what he saw with open eyes beyond was his comprehension, just as if he were dreaming. Trembling, he came closer to Jesus to touch his wounded palm, then he shouted in gladness "O Lord, my God!"

I am interested in the scene that pictures а common occurrence among believers. Many do believe in Jesus Christ as God, just like Thomas did. Jesus assures us of his being with us and of his protection. And vet people doubt his works. Regardless of our circumstances, let us focus



on Jesus response. He gently and patiently allowed Thomas to experience the truth of his resurrection through touch and sight. Jesus' loving kindness endures forever among all His people. That is His way of accepting us as we are, despite our sin. "Don't let yourselves fail to believe!" This is the message Jesus wants to tell to all believers, including you and me - blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.
